

View from the manse:

'Walking the Way: Living the life of Jesus today' 'For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God' (Romans 8:19)

This year the United Reformed Church is focussing on lifelong discipleship and mission. The Greek word for 'disciple' is mathetes; Andrew Roberts, author of the book 'Holy Habits', says 'It is often said to mean either a follower or a learner. The literal meaning is "one who learns as they follow".' (excerpt from Walking the Way leaflet produced by URC Church house).

As we commence 2018 and continue to roll out some of our responses to the 'Who Cares?' survey, we too will be focussing on what it is to be a disciple of Christ, not just in Church on Sunday but every day of our lives wherever we are. I would recommend two books for you to read, firstly 'Holy Habits' by Andrew Roberts, and secondly 'Fruitfulness on the Frontline' by Mark Green. Both are good reads and both explore principles of whole-life discipleship. The latter is the basis to the course that I am currently running at the manse on Thursday evenings and Joy and Alison are facilitating at the church on Monday afternoons. So, what is this 'front line' thinking all about? In a nutshell, our life in church is really only a portion of our whole life. A week is made up of 168 hours of which people are usually awake for around 120 hours. Most church members spend anything up to 10 hours directly engaging with church related activities so that leaves 110 hours spent elsewhere doing different things, at home, with the family, at work or in the local community. The question is does the 10 hours equip you to live well as disciples of Christ in the other 110 hours? And how does your experience in the 110 affect the activities in the 10? It is so easy to separate the 10 from the 110 yet they are all part of the wholeand God can and will work through it all.

How we live out in the world is important. Jesus sent his disciples (and that is us today) out to be salt and light in the world. We are filled with the Holy Spirit to be a Christ-like presence wherever we are 'For we are the aroma of Christ to God among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing' (2 Corinthians 2:15). I am not talking about evangelism here, though sometimes we may need to speak about our faith when people ask us. But, I am talking about being aware that we are the aroma of Christ among others. Allow the spirit of Jesus to infuse you with the good fruits... that is the fruits of the Spirit which are 'love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control' (Galatians 5:22-23). Through prayer ask God to show you what he is already doing and then join in.

So think about where your front line might be. Think about what God might already be doing in you and through you in that place, and open your heart so that you might learn as you follow. Let us explore together and learn from one another as we continue on our journeys as whole life disciples of Christ, walking His way every day.

Prayer Focus:

Colossians 1: 15-20

It isn't until you start to unpack a passage of the Bible that one gets to see the enormity of what Paul is getting at. At one of the 'Fruitfulness on the Frontline' meetings we were given these verses to grapple with. Out of it came the picture of Jesus as the creator at the beginning of time; supreme power in whom all things hold together, intimately involved in all aspects of creation. So involved that, to put things right, he came to declare God's nature to mankind and to bring reconciliation to God by the cross, not just of mankind but of 'all things', that is the whole of his creation. In Romans 8 we read that 'the whole creation has been groaning'... waiting for the fulfilment of God's plan. There is a sense of longing for the ultimate renewal to its former self or maybe its final glory and completeness. His love, care, involvement and delight in the whole of creation is something it is easy to forget and maybe we should look again at the part we should be playing too.

Prayer – Loving Lord, creator of all, it is so easy to have a narrow vision of your purposes to save mankind. Forgive us when we ignore your wider vision and help us to see where we can play our part in the care and renewal of your creation.

If you would like to contribute to regular giving and are a taxpayer, then the most effective way is through a standing order, alternatively we have weekly or monthly envelopes available. Please speak to Karen to get details of how to give in this way and for a Gift Aid Declaration Form.

If you are not a taxpayer we are still able to claim gift aid, through the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme, on cash put into the weekly offertory of up to $\pounds 20$ in any week. This can also be done if cash is given through weekly envelopes.

- I saw an assembly of people at London St., a testimony to the work remaining that the Lord has called us to do, with a river of silver light coming through the doors and out into the street.
- 'Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, PERSEVERE IN PRAYER'. Romans 12.12.
- Valuing one another as we journey together, offering ourselves, our time, our gifts.
- Opportunity to be quiet with the Lord without worldly distractions appreciated.
- General feeling that we are on the right track and that the finances will come. **Trust.**
- Keep on doing what we are and more. There will always be more but be encouraged. "Rejoice in the Lord – always!" London Street URC a Hub.
- Be prepared to be disciples outside the church and to suffer as a result. Act upon this will of God all year not just at Christmas.
- Acknowledge that God is working through us and give him thanks and praise.
- "Write down the vision" (Habakkuk 2 v 2) and plan how to get there. Vision Statement. Let everyone know.
- Direct giving as people give the Lord will bless.
- Shared ministry ease the load with house groups.
- Seek first the Kingdom of God. Work for the Kingdom of God.
- Be frank about our situation before God. Pray for definite things, e.g. more members.
- Picture the Holy Spirit as a narrow powerful river falling over a waterfall into the hearts of people waiting below.

Some words/phrases that stood out to those waiting on the Lord:

John 16 v 1. Ex 18 vv 8 & 9. Eph 4 – In Christ each of us is clothed with power. Call upon our Father God and then nothing is impossible. We know God will meet our need so that we can continue with his work here. We need to listen in order to <u>hear</u> – "He (the Holy Spirit) will speak whatever He <u>hears</u>".

Unity "When they <u>heard</u> it they raised their voices <u>together</u> and praised God". In Revelation 2 & 3 – good works of the churches were praised before weaknesses revealed.

Relationship – "I love loving God". "The people recognised that they (the believers) had been with Jesus."

We may need to spend in order to save money. Some practical suggestions made.
