THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

This month Beryl Wootton shares a psalm that has particularly resonated with her in her Bible studies.



Friends, I am following the United Reformed Church's Prayer Handbook for 2025. At the end of August I was praying that God would put into my mind something I could share with you all in October's Focus. I started thinking about this early because I was going to be on Holiday from 14th to 20th September, and the date for Focus items was 20th September.

One of the Psalms to read that day was 103, verses 1 to 8, but having got to verse 8 I did not want to stop reading so carried on to the end. My heart was "strangely warmed" as I read these words and felt this Psalm was what I should share with you all. Enjoy!!

Praise the LORD, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name. Praise the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all His benefitswho forgives all your sins

and heals all your diseases,
who redeems your life from the pit
and crowns you with love and compassion,
who satisfies your desires with good things
so that your youth is renewed like the Eagle's.

The LORD works righteousness and justice for all the oppressed.

He made known His ways to Moses,
His deeds to the people of Israel:
The LORD is compassionate and gracious,
slow to anger, abounding in love.
He will not always accuse,
nor will He harbour His anger for ever;
He does not treat us as our sins deserve
or repay us according to our iniquities.



For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is His love for those who fear Him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us. As a father has compassion on His children, so the LORD has compassion on those who fear Him;

for He knows how we are formed,
He remembers that we are dust.
As for a man, his days are like grass


THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT!



A VISIT WITH ADONAI: STORIES OF HOPE AND IMPACT

On Sunday, August 31, 2025, we had the privilege of visiting London Street United Reformed Church, Basingstoke. What a joyful and humbling experience it was! Although our son was originally scheduled to lead worship, a last-minute change to his flight meant he arrived a day late and sadly missed the opportunity.

Yet, in God's goodness, another door had opened. During the service, Mark Ward graciously invited us to share about the ministry of Adonai Centre in Uganda, a ministry that has been close to our hearts for 15 years. From the very beginning, Adonai has existed to give vulnerable children the chance to flourish through education, stability, and the love of Christ.

Adonai Centre: 15 Years of Hope

For the past 15 years, Adonai Child Development Centre has been a place of refuge and growth for vulnerable children. What began as a small effort to give children stability and education has grown into a vibrant ministry.

Today, 354 pupils attend Adonai School. About 100 of them still wait for sponsors. What they need most isn't just a meal or a uniform; it's stability. Sponsorship provides consistency, school fees, food, healthcare, and the assurance that they can keep learning without interruption.

But Adonai is more than a school. It is:

- A source of clean water and medical care
- A place of emotional and spiritual support
- A bridge into secondary education or vocational training

Adonai is more than a school — it's a bridge of hope.

A Story of Transformation

Nothing captures the heart of Adonai's mission more than the story of Henry and many more.

Henry came to Adonai at the age of eight, having lost both parents.

Through the care, stability, and opportunities he received, Henry completed his education, trained as a lab technician, and now works at Adonai Medical Centre, serving the very community that once cared for him.

Henry's journey is a living testimony of the transformation possible when a child is given a chance.

Gratitude and Partnership

We remain deeply grateful to Tadley URC and the Tadley community for your faithful involvement in this journey. A special word of thanks goes to "Jajja" Penny O'Bee, who has been an anchor of hope for so many years.

Although our son's voice was not heard in worship that morning, the Lord's voice rang out clearly through the stories and testimonies shared.

We left London Street URC encouraged by the warmth of your welcome and the commitment of some church members who committed themselves to sponsor some children, and we were reminded once again that while our plans may change, God's mission never does.

How You Can Get Involved with Adonai

Pray – Join us in praying for the 354 children at Adonai School, for the 100 children still waiting for sponsors, and for the staff who serve them daily.

Sponsor a Child – For less than the cost of a cup of coffee a day, you can provide education, healthcare, food, and stability for a child in need.

Sponsor a teacher – Sponsoring to teacher you can give access to education to the whole class of about 45 students.

Partner in Support – Churches, groups, and individuals can contribute toward projects such as clean water, medical care, or building homes for vulnerable girls.






